



# SEASHORE COVERUP

crochet pattern

KKAME DESIGNS

**Description:**

This crochet coverup has a simple construction using a beautiful shell stitch pattern in the front.

**Materials: based on size respectively.**

- **Primary color: Truboo (6, 7, 8, 9, 10 balls)**
- **Not included in the kit:**
- 3.5mm crochet Hook
- Scissors
- Needle
- Tape measure

**Sizes:** XS-XL

**Gauge:**

**Front** - 4"x4" = 26sts x 10 rows of pattern sequence

**Back** – 4"x4" = 18sts x 10 rows of double crochet

**Finished Garment Measurements:**

Size	Length	Width
XS	27.5"	18"
S	27.5"	20.5"
M	28"	23"
L	29"	25.5"
XL	29"	28"

**Pattern Notes:**

1. This pattern is made using US terminology.
2. The panels are written in rows. Turn after each row.
3. The ch 2 at the beginning of the row is counted as a stitch in the final count.
4. When a row ends in a Fpdc or Bpdc when following a sequence, simply make a dc into the last st.
5. Block before assembly

## Front Panel Pattern

Ch 110 (128, 146, 164, 182) +2

R1: dc into the 4<sup>th</sup> st from the hook. Dc in each st down the row.

R2: ch 2, bpdc, \*dc into next 7 sts, bpdc, bpdc. Repeat \* until end of the row. (110, 128, 146, 164, 182 sts)

### **Pattern Sequence:**

R3: ch 2, fpdc. \* skip 3 sts, 3dc-ch-3dc, skip 3 sts, fpdb, fpdc. Repeat \* until end of the row. (110, 128, 146, 164, 182 sts)

R4: ch 2, bpdc. \* skip 3 sts, 3dc-ch-3dc, skip 3 sts, bpdb, bpdc. Repeat \* until end of the row. (110, 128, 146, 164, 182 sts)

Repeat pattern sequence 19 (19, 18, 18, 18) times.

You are now going to start the neckline divide.

R43 (43, 41, 41, 41):

ch 2, fpdc. \*skip 3 sts, 3dc-ch-3dc, skip 3 sts, fpdb, fpdc. Repeat \* 4 (5, 6, 7, 8) times.

Dc, hdc, sc, slst, sc, hdc, dc, dc, dc, dc, hdc, sc, slst, sc, hdc, dc. Fpdc, fpdc.

Repeat \* until end of the row. (110, 128, 146, 164, 182 sts)

You are now going to work on one side of the neckline split.

R44 (44, 42, 42, 42): ch 2, bpdc. \* skip 3 sts, 3dc-ch-3dc, skip 3 sts, bpdb, bpdc. Repeat \* 4 (5, 6, 7, 8) times. Skip 3 sts, 3dc-ch-3dc, skip 3 sts, dc. (46, 55, 64, 73, 80, 82 sts)

### **Neckline Pattern Sequence #1**

R45 (45, 43, 43, 43): ch 2. \* skip 3 sts, 3dc-ch-3dc, skip 3 sts, fpdb, fpdc. Repeat \* until end of the row. (46, 55, 64, 73, 80, 82 sts)

R46 (46, 44, 44, 44): ch 2, bpdc. \* skip 3 sts, 3dc-ch-3dc, skip 3 sts, bpdb, bpdc. Repeat \* until end of the row. (46, 55, 64, 73, 80, 82 sts)

Repeat neckline sequence #1 11 (11, 13, 15, 15) times for a total of 68 (68, 70, 74, 74) rows.

R69 (69, 71, 75, 75): ch 2. \* dc, hdc, sc, slst, hdc, dc, fpdc, fpdc. Repeat \* until end of the row. (46, 55, 64, 73, 80, 82 sts)

Fasten off with a long tail about 20"

## Front Panel Pattern cont.

Attach yarn to opposite outer side.

R44 (44, 42, 42, 42): ch 2, fpdc. \* skip 3 sts, 3dc-ch-3dc, skip 3 sts, fpdb, fpdc. Repeat \* 4 (5, 6, 7, 8) times. skip 3 sts, 3dc-ch-3dc, skip 3 sts, dc. (46, 55, 64, 73, 80, 82 sts)

Neckline Pattern Sequence #2

R45 (45, 43, 43, 43): ch 2, \*skip 3 sts, 3dc-ch-3dc, skip 3 sts, bpdb, bpdc. Repeat \* until end of the row. (46, 55, 64, 73, 80, 82 sts)

R46 (46, 44, 44, 44): ch 2, fpdc. \* skip 3 sts, 3dc-ch-3dc, skip 3 sts, fpdb, fpdc. Repeat \* 6 times. skip 3 sts, 3dc-ch-3dc, skip 3 sts, dc. (46, 55, 64, 73, 80, 82 sts)

Repeat Neckline Sequence#2 11 (11, 13, 15, 15) times for a total of 68 (68, 70, 74, 74) rows.

R69 (69, 71, 75, 75): ch 2. \* dc, hdc, sc, slst, hdc, dc, bpdc, bpdc. Repeat \* until end of the row. (46, 55, 64, 73, 80, 82 sts)

Fasten off with a long tail about 20"

## Back Panel Pattern

Ch 121 (124, 126, 128, 131) +2

R1: dc in 4<sup>th</sup> st from the hook, dc in each st down the row. (121, 124, 126, 128, 131 sts)

R2-45 (51, 58, 64, 70) : ch 2, dc in each st down the row. (121, 124, 126, 128, 131 sts)

Fasten off

## Assembly

1. Line up front panel and back panel
2. Seam shoulders
3. From the shoulder seam, leave a 11" (11.5", 12", 12.5", 13") opening for the armhole and seam down, stop seaming 5" (or any preferred length) before reaching the bottom for a little bottom side slit.

## Neckline

1. Place stitch markers on the corner of the neckline.



Markers at the top corners of the neckline



Markers at the bottom corners of the neckline

2. Attach yarn to the back panel neckline.



You are now going to work in rounds to make the neckline.

Tips for even dc along side edge: dc goes into the post of the row and in the small circle between rows.



R1: ch 2, dc in each st until 2 sts from the marker. Dc2tog before the marker and dc2tog after the marker. Dc in each st until 2 sts to the next marker. Dc2tog before the marker and dc2tog after the marker. Continue in this pattern to the end of the round. Slst to end the round.



Move the stitch makers to the first dc2tog in each corner.

R2-3: ch 2, dc in each st until 1 st from the marker. Dc2tog, dc2tog. Dc in each st until 1 st to the next marker Dc2tog, dc2tog. Continue in this pattern to the end of the round.



Chain a long cord. Your cord should be long enough to lace back and forth as seen in the design. Each cord will vary depending on your desired length. Keep testing and chaining as long as you desire. Lace the chain across the neckline opening.

## **Sleeves**

Attach yarn to sleeve opening

R1: ch 2, dc evenly around the round

R2-3: ch 2, dc in each st around the round

Fasten off, repeat on opposite side



## **Abbreviations (US Terms):**

- Ch - chain
- Sc – single crochet
- Hdc – half double crochet
- Dc – double crochet
- Fpdc – front post double crochet
- Bpdc – back post double crochet
- Slst – slip stitch
- Dc2tog – double crochet two sts together
- St/s – stitch/es
